Dear Friends,

I can hardly believe that we are now into February. Where has the time gone? Last time I wrote to you we were preparing for Christmas and the birth of the Christ child. In no time at all so many things have changed......from Christmas decorations and carol singing to welcoming in the New Year......and from what seemed a bright, cheerful time to dull, miserable January.

We experience these changes each year, from December full of expectation into January which seems very flat after all the excitement and each year we cope by reminding ourselves that spring is just around the corner....days are getting longer.....and so we carry ourselves through the not so bright days.

Some changes are not quite so easily dealt with. When you have changes outwith your experience then you have no past knowledge to draw on. This can leave us feeling out of our depth and rather than try to think about what the changes may mean for us we give up in despair. [and that's before any changes have taken place] Changes are going to take place in Rutherglen Old and while we don't know what they will be like exactly, we do know that they will happen. It is important that you support and encourage each other, remembering you are not coping with change alone. We are all going to deal with things that may be new to us. Most people don't like change and prefer things 'the way they have always been'. Sadly, that is not always possible but if we embrace change then often, we are surprised by the way it improves the situation for everyone.

We are working towards a union with West & Wardlawhill Church. At the moment we are at the planning stage. Things never move quickly and that is good because when we rush, we make mistakes or overlook some important detail. So, what can we do? PRAY! We may feel that we don't know what to do or where we are going. The good news is that God knows what to do and knows exactly where He wants to lead us. This calls for a great deal of trust and even more patience. If you need a bit of inspiration, think of Abraham being sent into a strange land. That journey needed courage but also faith. Abraham trusted God and carried on safe in the knowledge God would travel with him and would guide him. It wasn't an easy journey but Abraham got there in the end.

Let us follow Abraham's example and set out on this journey with all our questions, doubts and fears but at the same time feeling confident that God will journey with us, that He will suffer our anxieties and disappointments with us and finally by His grace bring us to a place where we can grow and serve Him becoming the self- sacrificing servants He has called us to be.

A journey into unknown territory can be frightening but if we travel with an open mind we can discover many new places and ideas, new ways of doing things and make new friends along the way. TRUST God and He will prepare for all of your journeys. During this difficult and rather unsettling time may we all know God's richest.


FORTHCOMING COMMUNION SERVICES


